Create a Book Report Sandwich



Tired of chewing on the same old book? Are you ready to sink your teeth into a tasty book? With this Sandwich Book Report you will do just that!

Step 1

Choose your book. It may be historical or realistic fiction, humor, adventure, or fantasy.

Step 2 (63 points)

Build your tasty Sandwich Book Report using the following ingredients. Students will only receive one packet of ingredients which will be provided to you by me, the teacher. Be sure to read the rubric on the opposite side for more details regarding each piece of the sandwich. (9 points each)

- The "Top Slice of Bread": Write your name, the title, author, and genre of your book.
- First Layer "The Lettuce": Lettuce summarizes the book. Write a brief summary of the plot book.
- Second Layer "The Tomato": A slice of the setting. Draw or describe the story's setting.
- Third Layer "The Meat": Who is the meat of the story? Describe the main character.
- Fourth Layer "The Cheese": Write a brief summary explaining what part of the story made you smile and say cheese?
- Fifth Layer "The Onion": Was the story sweet or tearful? What is your personal opinion of the book?
- The "Back Slice of Bread": What is the theme of this book? Was there a lesson to be learned?

Step 3 (14 points)

Review each ingredient for correct spelling, grammar, and punctuation.

Step 4 (10 points)

Color each of slices using the following key. Keep in mind when coloring that you just lightly shade each page as I must be able to read your book report information on each slice. Or you may color the ingredient first and glue your written or typed information papers to each ingredient.

- Light Brown/Tan - Top Slice of Bread/Back Slice of Bread
- Green - The Lettuce
- Red - The Tomato
- Pink - The Meat
- Yellow/Orange - Cheese
- Purple - Onion

Step 5 (2 points)

Neatly cut out each of the ingredients and assemble them in the order as described in step three (letters A-G). Fasten all your ingredients together.

Step 6 (11 points)

Finally, on the attached page, give your opinion of the book and the book report. Be sure to include WHY with specific examples! Then turn your Sandwich Book Report with the rubric in for a yummy grade!

- G. The “Back Slice of Bread”: (9 Points)
What is the theme or message of this story? Was there a lesson to be learned? _____
