Eighth Grade Expectations

1st Quarter

1. Students will recite the the Sign of the Cross, the Glory Be, the Our Father, and the Hail Mary in Spanish (all year).
2. Students will use Spanish to describe class schedule, identify and describe school supplies.
3. Students will identify and describe articles of clothing..
4. Students will learn to correctly use the verbs **comprar**, **hablar**, **pagar** and **preferir**.
5. Students will learn to shop and state color and size of preferences.
6. Students will explain Birthdays and Saint Day celebrations in Spanish-speaking countries.

2nd Quarter

1. Students will speak in Spanish about going to school, and some school activities.
2. Students will describe where they and others go, while expressing direction and possession.
3. Students will use prepositions and contractions.
4. Students will learn to tell how they feel and how others feel.
5. Students will use verbs **ir**, **dar** and **estar** to describe people's activities.
6. Students will participate in a special mass in celebration of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

3rd Quarter

1. Students will learn to order food and beverages.
2. Students will identify some foods and will talk about food they like.
3. Students will use the verbs **comer** and **beber** and the adverbs of frequency.
4. Students will talk about differences between eating habits in the United States and in Spanish-speaking world.

4th Quarter

1. Students will identify family members and use the possessives; **mi**, **mis** and the verb **ser**.
2. Students will use Spanish adjectives to describe their home.
3. Students will talk in Spanish about what they have to do and what they are going to do.
4. Students will use Spanish vocabulary to discuss families in Spanish-speaking countries.
5. Students will participate in Cinco de Mayo activities.
